




Council-Manager Form

About the Finance Division

- City's Fiscal Year is July 1 June 30
- Manage Annual Budget
- Annual independent, outside audit
- Records receipts and processes payments for all city purchases.
- All financial documents are available for public inspection online and off.



Financial Management


- Administers \$80 million City budget
- Manages over \$15 million in City investments
- Structures and manages \$104 million in bonded debt
- Processes and pays about 30,000 invoices totaling over \$50 million annually



THERE IS NO SUCH THING AS GOVERNMENT MONEY

Typical Tax Paid

- Of the 8.475% sales tax, City Sales Tax is 2.75%
- A home owner with a house worth \$100,000 pays \$68.97 in property tax to the City.
- Residents pay \$12.10 for each \$10,000 of personal property that they own.



City Budget | Your Budget.

Recurring Revenues	Income, Paycheck
1-Time Revenue	Bonus, Gift
Funds: General, etc.	Housing, Food, other
Recurring Expenses	Monthly Bills, Utilities
1-Time Expense	Repair or major purchase

Budget Formula

Recurring Revenues (sales tax, property tax, etc.)

- Minus -

Recurring Expenses (personnel and operating expenses)

= Equals =

Amounts Available for One Time Costs (vehicles, operating equipment, and other one-time projects)

**Fund balances are one-time revenue sources and cannot be spent for recurring expenses. **



Revenue

- Taxes \$41,720,931 47.4%
- License/Permits \$1,836,844 2.09%
- Internal Revenue \$2,940,400 3.34%
- Service Charges \$33,588,261 38.16%
- Fines and Fort. \$627,500 0.71%
- Misc. \$2,249,921 2.56%
- Other Financing \$5,056,250 5.74%



Expenses

- Personnel \$29,236,862 38.45%
- Supplies 3,595,422 4.73%
- Contract Services \$19,348,420 25.45%
- General Ops. 1,353,021 1.78%
- Capital \$11,529,719 15.16%
- Special Projects \$2,028,201 2.67%
- Debt Service \$8,937,847 11.76%



*The golf course, SportsPlex, and sports complexes are the only funds whose operations are not totally supported by its user fees




